



Information for Campers and Cottage Guests at Baicatcan

What to Bring—Basically what you would bring to any camp

- Your own food
- Water bottles
- Flashlight (very important for walking outside at night)
- Clothing for a variety of weather
- Towel
- Sun protection for being outside
- Insect repellent in the summer
- **Campers:** Your tent, tarp, or other sleeping arrangements (insects are prevalent April through October) and sleeping bag (nights are often freezing in winter).
- **Cottage guests:** Sleeping bag or twin-size bed linens (nights are often freezing in winter)

Camp Rules

The conservation easement requires the following of all partners and guests:

- **Pets:** All pets must be leashed or confined and with a human handler at all times while on the property. Dogs are not permitted for overnight guests.
- **Motorized Vehicle Use:** Guest vehicles need to remain in designated parking areas, preferably in the lower bosque or along the road. Please do not drive anywhere else on the property.
- **Artifacts or Fossils:** Guests and partners are invited to look at artifacts and fossils, but please do not pick them up, disturb them, move them, or take them off the property. It is equally important to leave rocks in place, as they may be an integral part of an archaeological site.
- **Alteration of Habitat:** Please refrain from alteration of natural vegetation or soil.
- **Night-Lights:** Please refrain from the continuous use of night-lights that could interfere with wildlife habitat values.
- **Generators:** Please refrain from the continuous use of generators or other mechanical noisemakers, including radios and amplified music.

Also, please read the instructions posted in the composting toilet and the solar-heated shower and use these facilities correctly and respectfully of the next users.

Directions

From the south: From I-10, take exit 306 (N Pomerene Rd), and drive north through Pomerene. After a few miles there's a stop sign in Pomerene, turn right. Follow that road for about 24 miles. At mile marker 15, the pavement ends. Continue on to mile marker 23, where you pass over a concrete apron across a wash. Just after that there is a driveway on the right with a grey gate and a small sign that says "CCA." You can drive in and park there.

From the north: From AZ-77, take the Redington Rd. exit towards San Manuel. Drive south about 9 miles, through and past San Manuel. The road takes a hard left as it turns down into the river valley. Turn right where the paved road turns to follow the river south. After about 13 miles, (pavement ends in about the middle of that) there will be a fork in the road. Take the left to Cascabel. About 14 miles

later pass mile marker 24 and then go almost another mile. Just before you pass over a concrete apron across a wash, there is a driveway on the left with a grey gate and a small sign that says "CCA." You can drive in and park there.
